#### Membership

In May we have received an overview of the paying IASSID-members that are registered as a member of our SIRG-PIMD. This number totals up to 50 members. We were very surprised and pleased by that number. The SIRG-PIMD includes 11% of all IASSID-members that join one or more SIRGs. But this number could be larger, since at this moment 148 persons (!! ) are listed on our SIRG-mailinglist. First of all, we want to thank all those who join the SIRG-PIMD. You may be aware of the new policy of IASSID. In summary, this is, IASSID-members are free to choose any SIRG they want to join, without paying an extra fee. Each SIRG now receives an initial set amount of funding which is then topped up according to the number of members registered for each SIRG. #### Conferences

##### **21<sup>st</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> September 2007 - European Conference on Cerebral Palsy in Adolescence and Adulthood – Potsdam - Germany**

This conference is organised by the European Association of Intellectual Disability Medicine and Bundesarbeitsgemeinschaft Ärzte für Menschen mit geistiger oder mehrfacher Behinderung. The programme is targeted at physicians and physiotherapists but will be broad enough for other health professionals involved in CP care to attend.

##### **7<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> November 2007 - Roundtable SIRG-PIMD – Dundee, Scotland**

The next roundtable of our SIRG will be organised by James Hogg (White Top Research Unit, University of Dundee), Loretto Lambe (PAMIS, Dundee) and Martin Campbell (St Andrews University). It will take place on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> of November 2007 in Dundee (Scotland), hopefully with a visit to St Andrews included. Details about the venue and the programme etc will be announced

### **25<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> August 2008 – IASSID 13<sup>th</sup> World Conference – Cape Town – South Africa**

The next IASSID World Congress will be held in Cape Town from the 25<sup>th</sup> till the 30<sup>th</sup> of August 2008. For further information see [www.iassid.org](http://www.iassid.org). Prof. Carla Vlaskamp, from the Netherlands, will be a keynote speaker on profound and multiple disability. Before the congress a workshop will be organised about persons with profound and multiple disabilities for delegates from African countries. At the roundtable this November we will make more concrete arrangements about the symposia that we will organise with the SIRG-PIMD-see also below.

### **Papers and Symposia on Persons with Profound Intellectual and Multiple Disabilities for the IASSID Congress, Cape Town, 25 - 30, August 2008**

Our SIRG is coordinating the PIMD symposia and papers for the 2008 Congress. We plan to make a preliminary proposal of this programme and to discuss it on the roundtable in November. To be able to do this, we invite you to submit ideas for papers, posters or proposals for a symposium, on any topic of interest about persons with profound intellectual and multiple disabilities. Papers can cover a wide variety of topics, type and level of intervention and disciplines. ## European Masters Degree

The universities of Groningen (the Netherlands), Köln (Germany), Leuven (Belgium) and St Andrews (Scotland) are planning the development of a European Masters about persons with PIMD. The degree would take 2 years. Minimal requirements would be a bachelors degree (academic or professional). The degree is aimed at front-line staff, therapists, managers and any professional or parent who has the appropriate qualifications. The following modules are to be included: theoretical and methodological issues; assessment approaches; approaches to intervention; families in a life span perspective; design of services; a clinical case study and a research module. We will apply for Erasmus Mundus funds to further develop and start this programme and will keep you all informed of progress.
